



UI GreenMetric Awards 2024: Strengthening Sustainability in Higher Education

On December 12, 2024, the UI GreenMetric World University Rankings 2024 awards ceremony took place in São Paulo, Brazil, hosted by the University of São Paulo. This landmark event celebrated a significant increase in participation, with nearly 300 new universities joining the ranking, including Dulati University, which made its debut in the global list.

In 2024, the ranking included 1,477 universities from 95 countries, demonstrating the growing global commitment to sustainability. Among the new participants were universities from 11 countries, such as Algeria, Kenya, and South Korea. This expansion highlights the leading role of universities in driving change and promoting ecological responsibility.

Dulati University's Position in the Ranking.

Dulati University ranked 1291st globally and 22nd among Kazakhstani universities, showcasing its efforts in sustainable development and environmental responsibility.
